

Oregon Student Wellness Survey 2012 & Montoring the Future 2012

The Oregon Student Wellness Survey began with a dataset consisting of 65,659 surveys collected from 33 counties, 115 public school districts, and 422 schools. The filtering process removed records that had invalid grade values, reported ages that were out of sync with the reported grade levels, unrealistically high levels of use for illicit drugs or bad behavior and inconsistent responses to lifetime vs past 30 day use for illicit drugs. The final dataset consisted of 56,244 surveys (before weighting).







Gambling Initial Certification and Recertification Update From

Problem Gambling Director: Dick Johnson Effective July 1, 2013

- 1. CGAC I will now require 500 hours of supervised problem gambling experience of which 51% must be in the Clinical Domain. The current requirement is 100 hours of supervised experience.
- 2. 24 hours of problem gambling client case supervision from an approved CGAC II or NCGC II supervisor. Currently, there are no hours required here. Approved Problem Gambling Treatment Supervisor Registry to be created and the requirements established by July 1, 2013.
- 3. Six hours of ethics and six hours of suicide prevention training also required.
- 4. Six hours of ethics required for all CGAC levels for recertification.
